Power utility switches on to location

WA power utility Western Power has selected location technology specialist ESRI to provide a solution that will enable it to use geographical analysis to maintain and manage its energy network. When the system is fully developed it will allow Western Power to present and analyse data geographically to discover specific areas of power outage and sectors of the grid that are absorbing high demand.
